

Discussion Questions

- 1. How does Ally manage her relationship with her daughter while the rest of her life is in turmoil? Do you think she does a good job? How does Gabby deal with the changes in her parents' marriage? Does she grow over the course of the novel?
- 2. Gabby believes that life imitates fairy tales. From her perspective, what roles would various characters from the novel play? In what ways do these characters embody (or not embody) the parts in Gabby's fairy tale?
- 3. Faye accuses Ally of judging people too quickly. Do you agree with her? Did you judge any of the characters in this book too quickly, then change your mind? Who, and why?
- 4. Do you think adults are capable of making drastic change in their lives? What characters in the novel change the most? How?
- 5. What do you think of Ally's decision not to take Rose's money? What would you have done?
- 6. How would you describe Alex? Although he may not be the best husband, is he a good father? A good man?
- 7. "Xander" tells Ally that maybe it's best not to expose Gabby to her grandmother. Is he right? What do you think of her decision to have her mother live at home? What would you do? How does her decision affect Gabby? Ally?
- 8. What happens to Ally when George's phone rings? Why do you think she decides to walk away? Did she do the right thing? What would you have done? Does George still love her or was it something else?
- 9. Is Johnny a good match for Ally? Is he trustworthy? Where do you see them a year later?
- 10. What do you think of Ally's idea of happiness being in the small moments that we often take for granted? What is happiness for Ally? For Gabby? For you?
