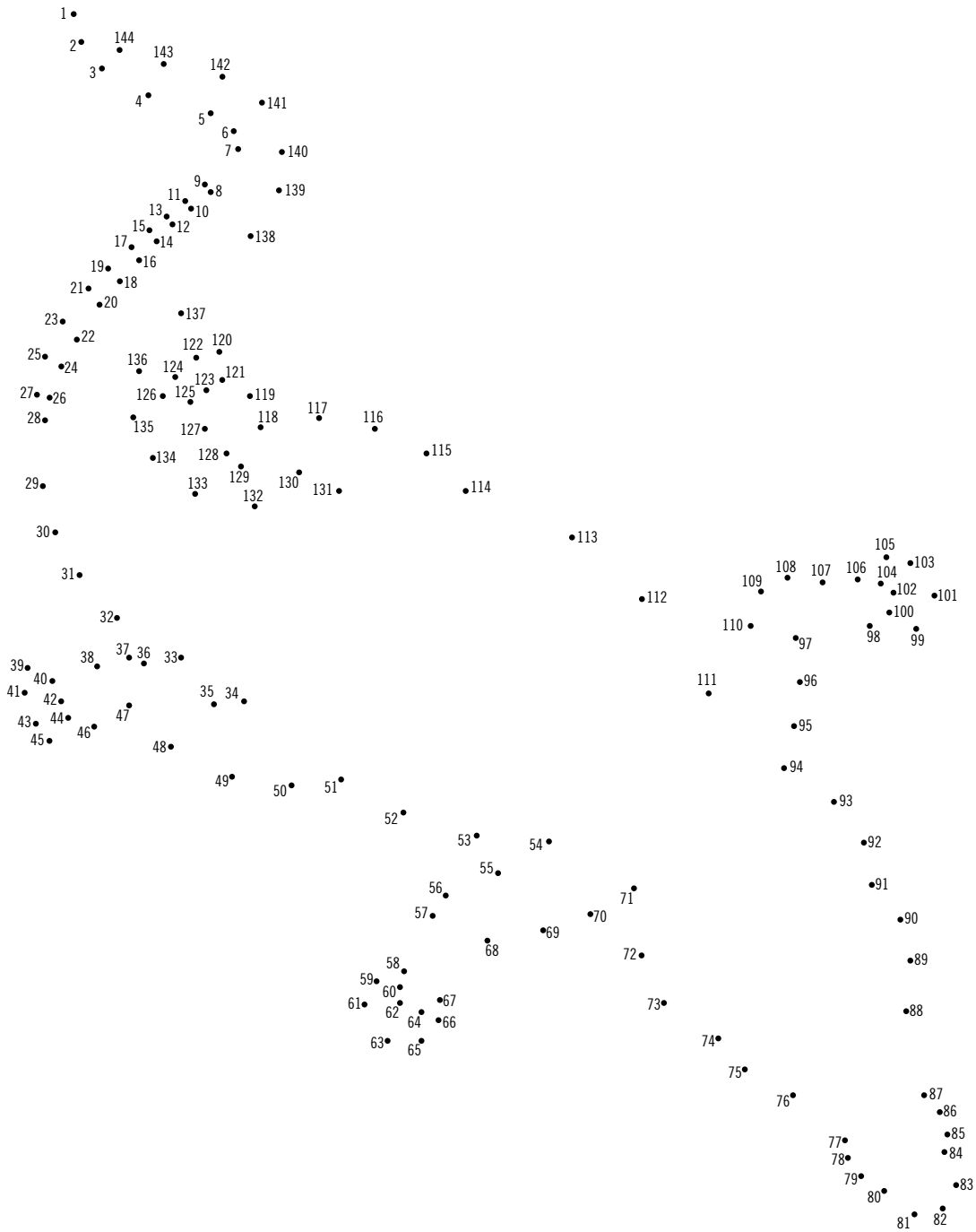

~ CROCODILE FACTS ~

- 1. Crocodiles are a living link to the dinosaur-like reptiles of prehistoric times!**
Their nearest living relatives are birds.
- 2. Crocodiles can grow to be 10 feet long!**
They're just eight to twelve inches long when they hatch from their eggs.
- 3. Crocodiles live to be anywhere from 50 to 75 years!**
They may live as long as 80 years.
- 4. Crocodiles are mostly nocturnal animals!**
They do most of their travel, hunting, and eating at night.
- 5. Crocodiles prefer freshwater environments like swamps, lakes, and rivers!**
Some species (like the one featured in *Crocs*) are capable of living in marine waters and may swim miles out to sea.

~ WAYS YOU CAN ~ PROTECT WILDLIFE!

- 1. Pick up trash!** Plastic bags and aluminum cans can trap birds and smaller animals, hurting them or making them easy prey.
- 2. Plant a tree!** Planting trees creates habitats and food for many insects and animals.
- 3. Build a bird feeder!** Hanging a bird feeder in your backyard provides an important food source for birds, especially during the cold winter months.
- 4. Reduce, reuse, recycle!** Recycling and reusing items minimizes our effect on the environment and helps conserve resources for wildlife all over the world.
- 5. Visit a National Park!** Visiting nature reserves helps to keep them running and offering animals safe habitats.
