

She survived her royal husband, and found happiness with Seymour--but it was shadowed by rivalry with the young Princess Elizabeth, whose affection Seymour coveted. Catherine won the contest, but at great cost.

Discussion Questions

- 1.) How does the character of Henry VIII change from his dashing, athletic young manhood at the Field of Cloth of Gold to his final years?
- 2.) Was Catherine Parr's high intelligence a help or a hindrance to her in surviving at the court of Henry VIII?
- 3.) Do you think Tom Seymour really loved Catherine, or was he merely using her to advance himself?
- 4.) In what ways were the lives of women at the Tudor court severely restricted? In what ways were they given latitude?
- 5.) Do you think Catherine Parr was a victim of her era or transcended it through her force of will?
- 6.) Which of Henry VIII's wives, as described in this novel, did you like best? Which did you respect most?
- 7.) Do you think Catherine Parr was a good stepmother, or merely a well-meaning one?
- 8.) Why did everyone (except Tom Seymour) dislike the young Elizabeth? Was it only because her mother was the disgraced Anne Boleyn, or were there other motivations?
- 9.) Overall, do you think Catherine Parr had a happy life? If not, how would you characterize her life?
- 10.) Would you have liked to live at the court of Henry VIII?
